Greater Akron Audubon Society 76th Christmas Bird Count Summary Report December 20, 2015

The 2015 Christmas Bird Count was conducted under dreary skies. The day started with a temperature of 21 degrees F., a 7 mph S wind with gusts up to 17 mph and ended with a temperature of 42 degrees F. There was no snow on the ground and no frozen waters. The weather was very similar to what we had in 2014.

This year we had 166 participants in the field and 55 at the feeders making for a grand total of 221, breaking our last year's record of 208 which put us in the top ten nationwide for participant numbers! 50 parties spent a total of 182 hours on foot, 81 hours by car, traveled a total of 168 miles on foot and 660 miles by car counting birds in the field. 6 parties spent 8.5 hours and traveled 54.5 miles listening/looking for owls and 55 individuals spent 37 hours counting birds at the feeders.

The 2015 CBC will certainly go down in our history book for rare and unusual bird sightings. On Count Day at Springfield Lake there was a rare sighting of a Kelp Gull, a visitor from the southern hemisphere, as well as an unusual sighting of 2 Lesser Blackbacked Gulls. During Count Week (3 days prior to the 20th and 3 days after the 20th), there were unusual sightings of Glaucous, Iceland and Thayer's Gulls. In other parts of our count circle there were unusual sightings of 2 Red-throated Loons and an Orange-crowned Warbler.

Our total number of species is 85 up from 2014 total of 79. However our total of 85 is pending since the sightings of the Kelp Gull, Lesser Blacked-back Gulls, Red-throated Loons and the Orange-crowned Warbler need to be approved by our Regional Editor after he reviews the documentation of each sighting.

The 2015 CBC will also go down in our history book for the large numbers of individual birds. The total number of individuals is an all time record of 68,471 compared to 27,685 in 2014. We have come a long way since our first CBC in 1939 when we had 1450 individual birds and 23 species with 9 participants. Our CBC counts could not have grown over the years without all the veteran and dedicated participants who have helped over many, many years and all the people who keep joining us. We thank you all for your participation counting birds in the field and/or at the feeder!
