HIKE: From Kendall Lake, take the Lake Trail to Kendall Hills and around Pine Hollow to Salt Run Trail back up to

Pine Hollow parking lot to Wetmore Trail to Langes Run Trail to Wetmore Rd. to Butler Trail to Valley Bridle Trail to

Bolanz Rd. to Towpath Trail south to the Ira Beaver Marsh Trailhead.
